(2) Every facility licensed under this part is required to maintain adverse incident reports. (3) Licensed facilities shall provide within 1 business day after the occurrence of an adverse incident, through the agency's online portal, or if the portal is offline, by electronic mail, a preliminary report to the agency on all adverse incidents specified under this section. The report must include information regarding the identity of the affected resident, the type of adverse incident, and the status of the facility's investigation of the incident. (4) Licensed facilities shall provide within 15 days, through the agency's online portal, or if the portal is offline, by electronic mail, a full report to the agency on all adverse incidents specified in this section. The report must include the results of the facility's investigation into the adverse incident. (6) _____, neglect, or _____ must be reported to the Department of Children and Families as required under chapter 415. (7) The information reported to the agency pursuant to subsection (3) which relates to persons licensed under chapter 458, chapter 459, chapter 461, chapter 464, or chapter 465 shall be reviewed by the agency. The agency shall determine whether any of the incidents potentially involved conduct by a health care professional who is subject to disciplinary action, in which case the provisions of s. 456.073 apply. The agency may investigate, as it deems appropriate, any such incident and prescribe measures that must or may be taken in response to the incident. (8) If the agency, through its receipt of the adverse incident reports prescribed in this part or through any investigation, has reasonable belief that conduct by a staff member or employee of a licensed facility is grounds for disciplinary action by the appropriate board, the agency shall report this fact to such regulatory board. (9) The adverse incident reports and preliminary adverse incident reports required under this section are confidential as provided by law and are not discoverable or admissible in any civil or administrative action, except in disciplinary proceedings by the agency or appropriate regulatory board. (10) The agency may adopt rules necessary to administer this section. The hospital reported to the facility that the resident had suffered a During an interview on at 10:55 AM, Staff A, Resident Care Assistant stated that Resident #1 was found lying in the grassy portion of the courtyard at approximately 4:45 AM. Staff A stated the resident had last been seen at approximately 3:30 AM sitting in the common area. Staff A stated, "When found she was . . . and so we gave her a warm shower and got her in warm pajamas and wrapped her up in a blanket. Later that morning she was sent to the hospital." During an interview on at 2:10 PM, the Administrator stated he believed that the Director of Resident Care at that time had filed an Adverse Incident Report. He further stated, "After looking, I can find no evidence that an Adverse Incident was ever filed, I agree that one should have been." Class III	A 165
