On 01/29/2015 a complaint investigation CCR#2015000829 was conducted at Change of Pace Retirement Center. A deficiency was found at the time of the visit.

Based on record review and interviews the assisted living facility failed to complete an initial 1 day adverse incident report for 1 of 1 sampled resident (Resident #1) for elopement that resulted in

Findings include:

1. During an interview at 9:36am on 01/29/2015, the Administrator reported Resident #1 had an altercation with another resident and then walked to his room. The Administrator reported that shortly after Resident#1 went to his room, he was then found to be missing from the facility. The Administrator reported that a missing persons report for Resident #1 was taken by the Ocala Police Department. The Administrator confirmed that the police later that evening informed her that Resident #1 was struck by a vehicle and was pronounced dead. The Administrator confirmed during the interview that she did not file an adverse incident report with the Agency.
2. A review of the facilities incident report dated 01/29/2015 revealed that Resident #1 had an altercation with another resident and walked off to his room. It also stated that someone picked him up and was later hit by a car that ended in 01/29/2015. Further review of the incident report revealed the Administrator's statement that she did not file an adverse incident report with the Agency because " She and her staff had done all she could do during the incident " .
3. A review of the Ocala Police Department incident report number #2015000015376 revealed on 01/29/2015 the Ocala Police responded to a call made by Staff A for missing person Resident #1. The report also revealed on 01/29/2015, Florida Highway Patrol reported a vehicle hitting a pedestrian on the Interstate (I-75), in Ocala. The pedestrian was confirmed to be Resident#1 who was pronounced dead.
