0000 - Initial Comments

On , an unannounced Limited Nursing Services monitoring survey was conducted at the The Willow at Wildwood, license #12648. The facility was not in compliance at the time of the survey.

0052 - Medication - Assistance with Self-Admin - 58A-5.0185 (3)

Based on observation and interview, the facility failed to ensure that an unlicensed Medication Technician (Staff A) brought medication in its original packaging to a resident (Resident #3) and read the medication label aloud to the resident for 1 of 3 observed medication passes.

On at 10:12 AM, an observation was made of Staff A, a Medication Technician (MT), assisting a resident (Resident #3) with the self-administration of medication. The MT was observed pushing the residents medications through the pack of the medication card into a clear plastic cup while standing at the medications cart. The MT did this for all 4 of the residents medications. The MT then brought the clear plastic cup to the resident seated in the wellness office. The MT handed the cup to the resident and stated, "Here are your pills." The resident took the medication. The MT did not bring the medication in its original packaging to the resident, and did not read the medication label to the resident.

On at 10:15 AM, an interview was conducted with Staff A. The staff member acknowledged that she should have brought the medication packaging to the resident and read the label to the resident.

On at 11:02 AM, an interview was conducted with the Director of Clinical Services (DCS). The DCS stated that Staff A should have brought the medication packaging to the resident and read the medication label to the resident.
