0000 - Initial Comments An unannounced licensure complaint survey, CCR#2018004278, was conducted on _____ at Solaris Senior Living Stuart, License #8963. The facility had a deficiency at the time of the survey. 0010 - Admissions - Continued Residency - 429.26(1&9) FS; 58A-5.0181(4) FAC Based on record review and staff interview, the facility failed to ensure 2 of 3 resident had a face-to-face medical examination by a health care provider 1) at least every 3 years after the initial assessment (Resident #3); and 2) after a significant change (Resident #2). The findings included: 1) During review of Resident #3's medical record, the most current Health Assessment contained in the Resident's record was his initial assessment completed on _____. A new assessment is required to be completed every 3 years, unless there is a significant change which occurs first. Resident #3 should have had a new assessment completed no later than _____, but a new assessment could not be found. 2) During review of Resident #2's most current Health Assessment, dated _____, Resident #2 is independent with all ADLs and does not need assistance with his medications. However, according to a Nurse's note dated _____, "[Resident #2's] son wants nursing to give [Resident #2] all his medications ...explained [to Resident #2] Level III services." Resident #2 had a significant change in level of care required and his ability to handle his own medications. During an interview with the Administrator and Director of Nursing on _____ at 2:30 PM, they acknowledged there had been a significant change with the Resident #2's ability to handle his own medications and the level of services needed, and agreed that Resident #3 should have had a new Health Assessment completed in _____, 2018 because his current Health Assessment had expired.
