0000 - Initial Comments A Complaint Investigation #2018007798 was conducted on Merrill Garden at Solivita Marketplace Assisted Living Facility, License# 12834 had a deficiency at the time of the visit. 0010 - Admissions - Continued Residency - 429.26(1&9) FS; 58A-5.0181(4) FAC Based on observation and interviews, the administrator failed to monitor the continued appropriateness of placement for 1 of 4 sampled residents (#3) and retained the resident who required total care with all activities of Daily living, (ADL's) and could not transfer which exceeded the continued residency criteria. Findings: On at 10:30 AM interviews with caregivers, it was revealed that resident #3 was total care with her ADL's, the resident would not assist at all with bathing and dressing and would state to the caregivers that she could not do it. The caregivers stated resident #3 could not transfer. Observations at 11:30 AM, revealed the private duty caregiver and the facility's caregiver instructed resident#3 who was in bed to place her feet on the floor. The private duty caregiver placed a gait belt around the resident. They both instructed the resident to stand the resident did stand. They instructed resident #3 to move from the bed to the wheel chair. When moving the resident from the bed to the wheelchair, resident #3 did not move her feet at all. The private duty caregiver and facility caregiver had to lift the resident to her wheelchair; her foot dragged the floor during the transfer. On at 11:35 AM, the administrator said she was not aware the resident required total care with ADL's and transfers. She said the resident needed more encouragement from the staff when doing her ADL's and then she would possibly assist. Class III
