0000 - Initial Comments A monitoring visit for compliance with Emergency Power Plan was conducted at the Eagles on A deficiency was identified at the time of the survey. 0200 - Emergency Environmental Control - 58A-5.036 FAC Based on record review and interview, the facility had not obtained an approval for its emergency power plan implementation that extended beyond the deadline, nor did it maintain a copy of said plan on the premises at all times. Findings included: Upon arrival at the facility at approximately 3:40pm on, the emergency power plan was requested but not furnished. The administrator stated at 3:50pm on that "she was unable to locate said document and that after calling her other facility, had determined it was over there." It then took over an hour and a half before her staff person was able to bring the plan to the facility in question. While reviewing the plan with the administrator, it became evident that according to a email from the Central office, the facility's extension request pertaining to its plan implementation had been granted. However, further review of related materials found an assisted living facility extension quarterly report--emergency environmental control plan from stating, "my plan is still being implemented and I will continue to provide quarterly reports." No response from the Central Office could be located among the facility records. In addition, a second quarterly report dated indicating "my plan has now been fully implemented and I will not be providing further quarterly reports was provided without an official reply from either the Central office or other state agency. Thus, it was unclear if the facility's power plan implementation had been formally recognized as of the visit.
