Finding: Inconclusive

Nature of Visit:

The Minnesota Department of Health investigated an allegation of maltreatment, in accordance with the Minnesota Reporting of Maltreatment of Vulnerable Adults Act, Minn. Stat. 626.557, and to evaluate compliance with applicable licensing standards for the provider type.

Initial Investigation Allegation(s):

The facility neglected resident 1 (R1) and resident 2 (R2) when they failed to supervise the residents and R2 entered R1's room and touched R1 in a sexual manner. In addition, the facility neglected R1 when they sent the incorrect medications with the resident when the resident left the facility for an outing.

Investigative Findings and Conclusion:

The Minnesota Department of Health determined neglect was inconclusive. It could not be determined if the alleged sexual contact occurred between R1 and R2 due to the facilities lack

of supervision. The facility documentation and staff interviews indicated no incidents of R2 entering R1's room and there was no indication R1 or R2 required increased supervision other than what had been assessed and was being implemented. The allegation regarding R1 being sent with incorrect medications was investigated. Review of the resident's medical record and medication administration record, there was no documentation of the wrong medication being sent with the resident. The alleged medication error had no known date(s) reported. No medication errors were identified for R1.

The investigator conducted interviews with facility staff members, including administrative staff, nursing staff, and unlicensed staff. The investigation included review of R1 and R2's medical records, facility employee records, incident reports, and facility policy and procedures. In addition, the investigator contacted law enforcement and the sexual assault advocate.

R1 resided in an assisted living memory care unit and had diagnoses including a stroke, vascular disease, and depression.

R1's medical record indicated the resident received assistance with bathing, dressing, grooming, repositioning, toileting, and transferring. The resident had impaired judgement and difficulty communicating but could be understood.

R2 resided in an assisted living memory care unit and had diagnoses including Parkinson's disease and muscle weakness.

R2's medical record indicated the resident received assistance with bathing, dressing, applying and removing anti-embolism stockings, grooming, and limited assistance with transfers and ambulating. The resident was identified as having impaired judgement.

A report indicated R1 reported to family and the police that R2 entered R1's room, reached into R1's pants, held R1's penis for less than 40 seconds, touched R1's leg, and then left the room.

The police report indicated R1's family reported R1 had been sexually touched by R2. The family member stated R1 called and stated another resident (R2) came into his room and touched his penis. The police report indicated the facility staff stated they spoke with R1 regarding the allegation and the resident changed the alleged incident details during their conversation. The facility indicated they found no information to support R1's allegation regarding R2 sexually touching him.

A second police report was filed by R1's family member which indicated R1 stated R2 came into his room again. The report indicated facility staff were interviewed and they stated management watched 6 hours of recorded video of the hallway outside of R1's room for the timeframe of the alleged incident. R2 was not seen entering or exiting R1's room. Law enforcement closed the report.

R1 and R2's medical record did not contain any documentation of the allegations and the facility had no incident reports regarding R1 and R2.

When interviewed, facility management staff stated they were unable to locate any documentation which indicated R1 and R2 had any prior incidents. R2 had a history of sexual gestures and comments towards staff but had no prior allegations or concerns regarding inappropriate sexual behavior with other residents.

When facility unlicensed staff were interviewed, they stated they had not observed R2 going into R1's room. The staff also stated R2 occasionally made sexual comments to staff, however, they had not observed any sexual comments or gestures made to other residents.

In conclusion, the Minnesota Department of Health determined neglect was inconclusive.

Inconclusive: Minnesota Statutes, section 626.5572, Subdivision 11.

"Inconclusive" means there is less than a preponderance of evidence to show that maltreatment did or did not occur.

Neglect: Minnesota Statutes, section 626.5572, subdivision 17

"Neglect" means:

- (a) The failure or omission by a caregiver to supply a vulnerable adult with care or services, including but not limited to, food, clothing, shelter, health care, or supervision which is:
 - (1) reasonable and necessary to obtain or maintain the vulnerable adult's physical or mental health or safety, considering the physical and mental capacity or dysfunction of the vulnerable adult; and
 - (2) which is not the result of an accident or therapeutic conduct.
- (b) The absence or likelihood of absence of care or services, including but not limited to, food, clothing, shelter, health care, or supervision necessary to maintain the physical and mental health of the vulnerable adult which a reasonable person would deem essential to obtain or maintain the vulnerable adult's health, safety, or comfort considering the physical or mental capacity or dysfunction of the vulnerable adult.

Vulnerable Adult interviewed: No, R1 does not live at the facility- R2 was unavailable.

Family/Responsible Party interviewed: Yes, both R1 and R2.

Alleged Perpetrator interviewed: Not Applicable

Action taken by facility:

The facility has reviewed current policies and procedures.

Action taken by the Minnesota Department of Health:

No further action taken at this time.

INITIAL COMMENTS: On July 27, 2022, the Minnesota Department of Health initiated an investigation of complaint #HL28545004C/#HL28545003M, HL28545002C/HL28545001M. At the time of the investigation, there were #18 residents receiving services under the Assisted Living with Dementia Care license. . The following correction orders are issued for #.HL28545004C/#HL28545003M, tag identification 0630, 1640.	0 000	The Minnesota Department of Health documents the State Licensing Correction Orders using federal software. Tag numbers have been assigned to Minnesota State Statutes for Assisted Living Facilities. The assigned tag number appears in the far left column entitled "ID Prefix Tag." The plan shall contain an individualized review or assessment of the person's susceptibility to abuse by another individual, including other vulnerable adults; the person's risk of abusing other vulnerable adults; and statements of the specific measures to be taken to minimize the risk of abuse to that person and other vulnerable adults. For purposes of the abuse prevention plan, abuse includes self-abuse. This MN Requirement is not met as evidenced by: Based on interview and record review, the licensee failed to develop and implement an updated individual abuse prevention plan (IAPP) for two of two residents (R1, and R2) with records reviewed. The facility did not update R1's IAAP after an allegation R1 inappropriately touched R2. R2 lacked an IAPP until a month after the allegation was made. The IAPP did not identify the reported concern or developed interventions regarding the reported concern. This practice resulted in a level two violation (a violation that did not harm a resident's health or safety but had the potential to have harmed a resident's health or safety, but was not likely to cause serious injury, impairment, or death), and was issued at an isolated scope (when one or a limited number of residents are affected or one or a limited number of staff are involved or the situation has occurred only occasionally). Findings include: R1's medical record included diagnoses of post ischemic stroke, vascular disease, and	0 630

On July 28, 2022, at 10:00 a.m., R1's family (F)-E member stated on February 26, 2022, she reported to registered nurse (RN)-B that R2 came into R1's room and put his hands down R1's pants. F-E stated RN-B told her she reviewed all camera footage for that night and spoke with the staff who we're working and R2 was not observed in R1's room. R1's nursing assessment, dated March 22, 2022, indicated R1 required assistance of two staff and a mechanical sit to stand lift to transfer. R1 required staff assistance with meal setup, grooming, and bed mobility. R1 was able to communicate with difficulty but could be understood. The assessment indicated R1 was at risk for being abused. R1's Individual Abuse Prevention Plan (IAPP) dated December 28, 2021, indicated R1 was at risk for abuse. However, the IAPP did not indicate specific, individualized interventions regarding R1's risk for abuse. The IAPP indicated a Vulnerable Adult Assessment would be completed on admission and annually thereafter to assure that the resident vulnerabilities were identified. R1's IAPP dated May 24, 2022, listed the same vulnerability's as the prior IAPP assessment dated December 28, 2021, with no specific interventions to reduce the risk of abuse. There were no changes or updates made to the IAPP after the allegation of R2 inappropriately touching R1 three months prior. R2's IAPP dated March 29, 2022, indicated R2	0 630			

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0 630	Continued From page 3 had impaired judgement and had difficulty communicating. R2 was vulnerable and was at risk for abuse. R2's IAPP did not identify any specific, individualized interventions regarding R2's risk for abuse. R2's Planned Services (document for unlicensed personnel instruction of care) dated August 10, 2022, and July 26, 2022, indicated if the resident was inappropriate with another resident staff were to remove the resident from area and notify the RN immediately. During interview on August 15, 2022, at 10:40 a.m., registered nurse (RN)-C stated the facility had no updated IAPP's for R1 and R2 which identified the alleged incident and/ or specific interventions to prevent potential abuse. A policy regarding IAPP's was requested but not provided. TIME PERIOD FOR CORRECTION: Fourteen (14) days.	0 630

During interview on August 15, 2022, at 10:40 a.m., registered nurse (RN)-C stated the facility had no service plans for R1 and R2. The facility Service Plan policy dated June 20, 2022, indicated all residents receiving assisted living services would have a service plan in place.
