	Initial Comments Inspector Comments: This Statement of Deficiencies was generated as a result of a COVID-19 focused infection control State Licensure survey conducted at your facility on 11/25/20, in accordance with Nevada Administrative Code (NAC) Chapter 449, Residential Facility for Groups. The facility is licensed for ten Residential Facility for Group beds for elderly and disabled persons and/or persons with Alzheimer's disease, Category II residents. The census at the time of the survey was nine. The facility had no residents or staff positive with COVID-19. The focused COVID-19 infection control survey included the following: Observations: - Facility staff checked the temperature of the health facility inspector prior to entry to the facility. - The health facility inspector was required to answer COVID-19 screening questions related to symptoms, travel history, and exposure to the virus at other facilities prior to entry to the facility. - The health facility inspector was asked to use hand sanitizer prior to entry to the facility. - Residents were in the dining area eating and observing social distancing. - The caregivers wore surgical masks and gloves while providing care. - The caregivers washed hands and utilized alcohol-based hand sanitizers before and after interacting with residents. - Hand sanitizer was located at the main entrance and throughout the facility. Interview: The Owner verbalized the following: - Screening and temperature checks were completed for staff and healthcare workers upon entrance to the facility. - Temperature checks for residents were conducted once a day in the morning. - Medical professionals were the only persons allowed entry to the facility. - Residents were served meals in the dining area with a chair removed between residents to adhere to social distancing practices. - Activities were provided in bedrooms. - Staff sanitized all high touch areas three to four times a day with disinfectant wipes. - The facility had 20 boxes of gloves; 300 surgical masks; two N95 masks; 25 gowns, ten face shields; three canisters of Clorox wipes; 1200

	disinfecting wipes; two electronic non-contact thermometers; six 20 oz hand sanitizer bottles. - Training was held for staff on proper donning and doffing personal protective equipment (PPE) on 09/30/20 and every month trainings are held. - The facility had two N95 masks. Two of the employees were scheduled to be medically cleared and fitted for N95 masks on 11/25/20. The owner was advised to purchase more N95 masks. Record Review: - Infection Control Program policies and procedures documented measures to ensure isolation and prevention of COVID-19. - Standard and transmission-based precautions for COVID-19. - Visitor entry and facility screening practices including screening questions, hand sanitization and temperature checks. - Education, monitoring and screening practices of staff including proper PPE use, temperature checks, hand washing and sanitization. - Facility policies and procedures to address staffing issues during emergencies, such as the transmission of COVID-19. - Separate area will house residents in the case of a positive resident in the facility. - Documentation staff was scheduled for fit testing and to be medically cleared for N95 masks on 11/25/20. The findings and conclusions of any investigation by the Division of Public and Behavioral Health shall not be construed as prohibiting any criminal or civil investigations, actions or other claims for relief that may be available to any party under applicable federal, state, or local laws.
