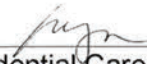

WAC 388-76-10805 Automatic smoke alarms.

(1) The adult family home must ensure approved automatic smoke alarms are installed and maintained according to manufacturer instructions;

(2) At a minimum, smoke alarms must be located in the following areas:

(b) In the immediate vicinity of resident bedroom(s), and if applicable, the sleeping areas used by the adult family home staff; and

This requirement was not met as evidenced by:

Based on observation and interview, the adult family home (AFH) failed to ensure there was a smoke detector in proximity to the area where residents and staff slept affecting 2 of 6 residents (Resident 1 and Resident 5) and 1 of 3 staff (Staff B, Caregiver). This failure placed the residents and staff at risk for injuries in case of a fire outside their bedrooms.

Findings included...

On 02/28/2024 at 12:50 PM, observation of the home's layout showed Bedrooms A, B, and C were on one side of the AFH. Bedroom D, the dining room and staff bedroom was on another side of the AFH and in between these two areas were the living room and kitchen. Bedroom D, occupied by Resident 1 and Resident 5 was next to the dining room and across it was Staff B's bedroom. During the smoke detector alarm testing at 1:00 PM, it was observed that there was no smoke detector found in area of proximity to Bedroom D and staff bedroom.

On 02/28/2024 at 1:05 PM interview, Staff A, Provider said that there was never a smoke detector in immediate vicinity of Bedroom D. Staff A said that they would call someone to attach one as soon as possible.

WAC 388-76-10415 Food services. The adult family home must:

- (1) Ensure that the safe food handling training requirements of chapter 388-112A WAC are met; and

WAC 388-112A-0600 What is continuing education and what topics may be covered in continuing education?

- (2) The same continuing education course must not be repeated for credit unless it is a new or more advanced training on the same topic. However, a long-term care worker may repeat up to five credit hours per year on the following topics:

- (d) Food handling training;

WAC 388-112A-0610 Who in an adult family home is required to complete continuing education training each year, how many hours of continuing education are required, and when must they be completed?

- (1) The continuing education training requirements that apply to certain individuals working in adult family homes are described below.

- (a) The following long-term care workers must complete 12 hours of continuing education by their birthday each year:

- (iv) An adult family home provider, entity representative, and resident manager as provided under WAC 388-112A-0050 .

- (f) A long-term care worker who completed basic or modified basic training after June 30, 2005, is not required to have a food handler's permit. For a long-term care worker who completed basic or modified basic caregiver training before June 30, 2005, and does not maintain a food handler's permit, continuing education must include one half hour per year on safe food handling in adult family homes as described in RCW 70.128.250 .

- (2) A long-term care worker who does not complete continuing education as required under this chapter must not provide care until the required continuing education is completed.

This requirement was not met as evidenced by:

Based on observation, interview, and record review, the Adult Family Home (AFH) failed to ensure 2 of 3 sampled staff (Staff A and Staff C) had current continuing education requirements in food safety training. This failure placed residents at risk for unmet needs according to current caregiving standards and for food borne illnesses related to food handling issues.

Findings included...

On 02/28/2024 at 11:50 AM in the kitchen, observation showed Staff A, Provider

preparing lunch for residents (Resident 1, Resident 2, Resident 3, Resident 4, and Resident 5). At about 12:15 PM, Staff A served lunch to Resident 1, Resident 3, and Resident 5 in the dining room. At 12:20 PM, Staff A was feeding Resident 4 in the living room.

On 02/28/2024, Staff A and Staff C, Caregiver record review showed a food worker card expired on 04/08/2023. There was no other food handling or food safety continuing education found in Staff A and Staff C's record. Staff A and Staff C had an expired food worker card for 10 months.

On 02/28/2024 at 02:45 PM interview, Staff A said that they and Staff C did their food worker training at the same time. Staff A added that they were not aware their food handling card had expired.
