F 253	483.15(h)(2) ENVIRONMENT The facility must provide housekeeping and maintenance services necessary to maintain a sanitary orderly, and comfortable interior. This REQUIREMENT is not met as evidenced by: Based on observation, staff interview, and resident interview, the facility failed to ensure daily cleaning of two residents rooms on the second floor. The findings were: Observation on 2/14/05 at 8:55 AM of room number 212 revealed two wadded paper napkins were visible in the floor traffic area near the "A" bed. Further observations at 11:46 AM and 1:23 PM revealed the napkins remained on the floor until 2:29 PM when the napkins were gone and the floor was clean Confidential interviews were done with five residents on 2/14/05 between 8:57 AM and 9:59 AM. Two residents stated the over-bed lights had not been dusted for "a while." One resident stated that staff failed to clean the floor corners. The resident stated if something got dropped on the floor, it became a "game" to see how many days the item/trash would remain on the floor. Observation on 2/14/05 from 8:57 AM to 9:12 AM of the over-the-bed wall lights in rooms 221 and 216 revealed a thick dust coating on the lights. Interview with housekeeper #1 at 9:50 AM on 2/14/05 revealed the resident floors were supposed to be mopped daily and over-bed lights were supposed to be dusted daily.
